



MONTGOMERY GI BILL :

"Money for college!"

The Montgomery GI Bill is advertised and believed as the answer to many young people's problem with finding a way to finance college. However, there are a few things to know and let others in on...



To get \$70,000 you must qualify for the Army College Fund or Navy College Fund, something only 1 in 20 enlistees are able to do. Some of these qualifications include:

serving 2 years active duty,

have an AFQT (Armed Forces Qualification Test) score of 50 or higher,

and enlist in a specific Military Occupational Specialty (usually unpopular jobs that have no transferrable skills to the civilian world) designated under the ACF or NCF.

Otherwise the maximum you can get from the MGIB is \$36,144. That \$36,144 includes, believe it or not, \$1,200 of your own money! So, now we're down to \$34,944.

To receive any of that \$36,144 you must be among the eighty percent of veterans to receive an honorable discharge. Even after all this, you still may not see all of your benefit. Because of the monthly benefit payment structure, you have to attend school for four years to get all \$36,144. Only 15% of those who pay in have graduated with four year degrees! If you are among the majority who attend a two year school, you'll receive a maximum of \$18,072. Subtracting your \$1,200, you'll have only netted \$16,872 from the military!

As bad as this sounds, for most recruits who have paid into the Montgomery GI Bill it's eve worse. Only 35% of all program participants have received any benefits at all! Two-thirds of Montgomery GI Bill participants are paying nonrefundable deposits of \$1200 without receiving a dime in return!

Counter-recruitment is one of many ways for students to resist the pressure that the military- industrial-academic complex exerts on youth. Done effectively, it can notivate more students to get involved. Counter-recruitment also presents alternative ptions for students considering enlisting in the military and the realities of military ife – the cold, hard truth that is never presented by the military-industrial-academic complex



different forms. At its core the goal is at keep young people from joining the military, or at least provide more information about what they may be getting involved in.

Often times it means that people set up tables in high schools to pass out flyers and talk to students about the military and their options.

Truth in Recruiting often involves veterans (and other activists) sharing their experiences in classrooms. Other activities include: Opt-out campaigns, organizing against JROTC programs, protesting at recruiting stations and most importantly, providing information about alternatives to the military. To counter recruitment, you have to know what you are up against and what is appealing about the military and militarism to young people.



ORGANIZING GUIDE/TIPS

Young people as leaders

Because young people are the ones being targeted for recruitment, they are the most affected and therefore, must be at the forefront of organizing against military recruitment. If you are a young person, gather your friends and get started!! If you are an adult ally, seek some young folks to support and help out in a much needed area: resear; hing afternatives to the military. Everyone should support youth leadership development, get organizer/leadership training for young people.

tary is tracking your moves. Contact data is regularly released to military recruiters. Once they have the data, you will routinely get phone calls, texts, mailings or surprise visits. They will bombard and try to sell the military to you, based on your favorite hobby or brand of jeans. Like football? Well, you could play football in the Army. Oh, you're a musician? Play in the Navy band. Like cute boys? Well, the military is just full of 'em.



WHAT WOMEN EXPERIENCE

Women often join the military to gain skills and break out of traditional roles. However, while the range of military work open to women has increased over the years, women are still limited in the positions open to them. And within those positions, they are often given traditional tasks: according to one government report, "many women report that they are not allowed to work at the jobs for which they were trained... land; that they are routinely assigned clerical or administrative duties instead of being given the opportunity to work in the full range of their occupations" (GAQ/NSIAD-99-27, 11/98).

Sexual harassment and rape are a real threat to women in the military. One survey found that 30% of women reported being victims of rape or attempted rape while in the military, 75% had experienced sexual harassment (Reuters Health, 3/14/03).

THE MYTH OF EQUALITY

The military claims it treats everyone the same, regardless of skin color; but in reality, it has serious problems with inequality in the ranks. In 2001, 36.2% of the emisted personnel were people of color, but they made up only 18.2% of the othices Latinos in the Marine Corps, for example, made up 14.5% of the emisted ranks, but only 6.2% at the othices (Dept. of Defense, Demographic Profile of the DoD and Coast Cuard, Sept. 2004).

Discrimination against gays, lesbians and bisextude is not only intense within the military, it is official policy. Since the so-called "Don't ask, don't toll" policy was introduced, efforts to kick lesbian and gay personnel out of the military have continued; the pace of forced discharges has increased, and violence and threats against those suspected of being gay are routine.

YOU WILL LOSE BASIC RIGHTS

- If you leave your work without permission, you can be arrested.
- Any disobedience can result in criminal punishment
 You can be punished without the right to see a lawyer or have a trial.
- Your right to say what you think when and how you want will be restricted.
- Individual expression through the way you dress and wear your hair won't be tolerated.
- You will be subject to routine urine tests for drugs
